PICK UP AND DROP OFF

We realize that there have been changes to the pickup and drop off processes this year for students. These changes have been made with student safety in mind.

Drop off—The doors open each day at 8:00 am for students to enter the building. This time is set because our play ground and breakfast supervisors to monitor students do not start until 8:00 each day. Parents are asked to not send or drop off their children until this time. If they arrive prior they will be asked to wait in front of the building until the doors open. Parents are welcome to come in after 8 o'clock to talk to their child's teacher if the teacher is available.

Dismissal—Thank you for everyone's cooperation in waiting outside until student dismissal for student safety. With parents waiting outside, we recognize that this is causing another issue with lots of congregating at the door. We are working with our local authorities to evaluate traffic patterns during dismissal to improve upon pickup processes. Do you need to visit with your child's teacher at pickup? Not a problem. At dismissal the doors will unlock and you are welcome to come in to have a conversation with your child's teacher if the teacher is available. You can also come to the main door and buzz in.

WALKING AT THE SCHOOL

WHAT IS TITLE 1?

Parents/Guardians may have noticed that along with the job of being an elementary principal, Mrs. Leach is also working as our school's Title 1 coordinator. Title I is part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. The goal of Title I is to provide instructional services and activities that support students in meeting our state's challenging performance standards. Funding received through Title I most often coordinates with the regular education program. A large majority of this happens in class, helping students to best engage the curriculum. On occasion, Title 1 services supplement the regular education program. Ontonagon has what is known as School Wide Title I. What are the goals of the schoolwide programs? Here in Ontonagon, we are working to:

 Improve teaching and learning through teaming and small group instruction within the classroom

- New Curriculum in Reading for grades K-6
- Students are progress monitored after benchmark assessments K-8 After the first test we keep on rechecking that learning opportunities are working to help students close identified learning gaps

Research shows that how well a child does in school depends a great deal upon how much the adults in their lives get involved in their education.
